1.1 Introduction:

1.1.1 This Request For Bid seeks bids from qualified organizations to prepare, furnish and apply an approved Class 2 Solvent free coating to bridge decks, parapets, sidewalks, curbs, medians or other appurtenances as specified and as indicated below and in accordance with terms and specifications of this RFB.

- All bridges to be sealed are overhead structures built as part of the I-64 corridor construction between Kingshighway Blvd. and Spoede Rd., St. Louis City, and St. Louis County and are listed in section 2.2.1 of the Scope of Work.

2.1 General Requirements

2.1.1 The contractor shall prepare and treat Portland cement concrete surfaces with an approved penetrating sealer as specified in these provisions. The concrete surfaces to be cleaned and sealed shall include bridge decks, parapets, sidewalks, curbs, medians or other appurtenances as specified in these provisions.

2.1.2 The required sealer shall be a Class 2, solvent free coating used in lieu of the normal surface sealing for concrete in accordance with Sec 703 and JSP 07-08. The solvent free sealer shall be listed on MoDOT's Pre-Qualified Product List and meet the requirements in accordance with this job special provision.

2.1.3 The contractor shall provide all deliverables/services to the sole satisfaction of MoDOT.

2.1.4 Unless otherwise specified herein, the contractor shall furnish all material , labor, facilities, equipment, and supplies necessary to provide the deliverables/services as required herein.

2.1.5 Required Specifications – All materials, equipment, and/or services bid upon must comply with all pertinent standards and specifications as accessible on the Missouri Department of Transportation website (www.modot.mo.gov) under "Business With MoDOT", and "Standards and Specifications". The effective version will be determined by the letting date of the project.

2.1.6 The supplemental bidding documents mentioned above contain all current revisions to the bound printed version and have important legal consequences. It shall be conclusively presumed that they are in the bidders' possession, and they have been reviewed and used by the bidder in the preparation of any bid submitted for this project.

2.2 Table of Bridges to Be Sealed

2.2.1 All bridges to be sealed are overhead structures built as part of the recent I-64 corridor construction between Kingshighway Blvd. and Spoede Rd. and are listed in the following table:

2.3 Materials Requirements

2.3.1 Solvent-Free Bridge Deck Coating. The bridge deck coating shall be a solvent-free 100% solids isobutyltrialkoxysilane, with low oligomer and polymer compound content. The sealer used shall be Protectosil BH-N as manufactured by Evonik Industries (c/o Shield Systems, Inc. St. Louis, MO) or an equivalent equal from the MoDOT pre-qualified list that meets all of the criteria listed in the material requirements below:

- Purity: 98% minimum monomer by weight
- Solvent: Less than 0.1% by weight
- Siloxane or Polymer Residue: Less than 0.1% by weight
- Chloride Ion Content: Less than 40 PPM
- Density – ASTM D2111: 7.2 to 7.4 pounds per gallon
- Flash Point – ASTM D93: greater than 145 degrees F
- Dry Time – ASTM D7539: less than one hour

2.3.2 The coating shall meet the following performance criteria based on a single application at the manufacturers recommended application rate. All test specimens shall be produced using MoDOT Class B-2 concrete per Section 501.

2.3.2.1 Absorption. The absorption of the treated concrete under total immersion shall not exceed 0.5 percent after 48 hours or 1.5 percent after 50 days per ASTM C 642 as modified below for non air-entrained concrete. Concrete shall be proportioned and mixed in accordance with MoDOT Class B-2 per section 501.

2.3.2.2 In addition to ASTM C 642 section 4.1, one 4-inch (10 cm) diameter by 4 inch (10 cm) long core shall be retrieved from the surface of a Portland cement concrete to which coating has been applied. The core shall be oven dried as designated by ASTM C 642 section 5.1. The core shall be sealed with a rapid setting two part epoxy on the sides and bottom. The epoxy shall overlap the top edge of the core 1/8" (3mm). The core shall be weighed to determine the oven dry weight (mass) of the core and coating. The weight (mass) shall be designated as "A".

2.3.2.3 The core, processed in accordance with Section 2.4.2.1 of this job special provision, shall be immersed in a suitable receptacle and covered with tap water. The procedure as designated by ASTM C 642 section 5.2 shall be followed to determine the soaked surface dry weight (mass) of the core and coating. This weight (mass) shall be designated as "B".

2.3.2.4 The percent moisture absorption of the core shall be determined by ASTM C 642 section 6.1, equation (1). ASTM C 642 sections 5.3, 5.4, 6.1 and equations (2) through (7) shall not apply.

2.3.3 Salt Water Ponding. After 90 days ponding of 3 percent NaCL solution per AASHTO T 259, the chloride ion content of the concrete shall not exceed 0.5 pounds per cubic yard (0.30 kg/m³) at 1/2 to 1 inch (13 to 25 mm) depth.

2.3.4 Skid Resistance. The skid resistance of the treated concrete deck shall not reduce by more than 10 percent as compared to the same untreated concrete deck. A 5 test average shall be performed in accordance with ASTM E 274 using ASTM E 501 ribbed tire at 40 mph (64 kph).

2.3.5 An independent laboratory report shall be submitted with the Bid, certifying that the product offered satisfies the performance, chemical, physical, and environmental requirements of the specifications.

2.3.6 The coating shall not permanently stain, discolor or darken the concrete. Application of the sealer shall not alter the surface texture or form a coating on the concrete surfaces. Treated concrete shall be surface dry within 60 minutes after application. Coating shall not leave residue on glass, painted metal or automobiles.

2.3.7 The coating containers shall be unopened prior to usage for this project and shall contain the manufacturer's label identifying the product and all seals shall be intact. Each container shall be clearly marked with the following:

- Manufacturer's name and address
- Product Name
- Date of manufacture and expiration
- Lot identification
- Storage requirements

2.4 Construction Requirements

2.4.1 Equipment. A low pressure, high volume pump should be used for product application. A "spray bar" apparatus shall be used to provide uniform application. The spray equipment, tanks, hoses, etc. shall be thoroughly clean, free of foreign matter, oil residue and water prior to applying the treatment. For sealing the top surfaces of parapets and sidewalks only, power rollers or brushes may be used for sealer application in accordance with product manufacturer recommendations. For vertical surfaces such as parapet faces, brush and roller application will not be allowed, low pressure sprayers shall be utilized to allow sufficient application of sealer.

2.4.1.2 The chosen equipment shall be submitted in writing to the Engineer and shall be approved by both the product manufacturer and the Engineer at least 7 days prior to operation.

2.4.2 Cleaning and Surface Preparation. At a minimum, the surface shall be cleaned to remove dust, dirt, oil, wax, curing components, efflorescence, laitance, and other foreign materials that may inhibit penetration, as may be accomplished by power sweeping, along with vacuuming or blowing. The manufacturer or manufacturer's representative shall approve the use of chemicals and other cleaning compounds to facilitate the removal of these foreign materials before use. The treatment shall be applied within 48 hours following surface preparation.

2.4.2.1 Surfaces, which are to be treated, shall meet the approved product's requirements for surface condition and meet final approval of the Engineer. The contractor shall furnish the Engineer with written instructions for surface preparation requirements and a representative of the manufacturer shall be present to assure that the surface condition meets the manufacturer's requirements.

2.4.2.2 Cleaning equipment shall be fitted with suitable traps, filters, drip pans and other devices to prevent oil and other foreign material from being deposited on the surface.

2.4.2.3 All bridge deck drains, floor drains or any other drainage inlets or components of a drainage system within the sealing limits shall be sufficiently covered or protected prior to cleaning and sealing to prevent debris or sealer from entering these inlets.

2.4.3 Contractor Qualifications. The sealing material manufacturer representative must be on site to verify proper application methods and rates are being performed by the contractor. This requirement may be waived at the discretion of MoDOT if the contractor provides written approval from the material representative that they have past experience with application of the product and have achieved satisfactory results.

2.4.4 Test Application. Prior to final application, the contractor shall treat a measured test coverage area on horizontal and vertical surfaces of the different components of the structure to be treated for the purpose of demonstrating the desired physical and visual effect on an application or of obtaining a visual illustration of the absorption necessary to achieve the specified coverage rate. In the latter case, the applicator shall use at least ½ gallon (1.9 liter) of treatment following the manufacturer's recommended method of application for the total of the test surfaces. Horizontal test surfaces shall be located on the deck and on the curb or sidewalk, and vertical test surfaces shall be located on a parapet or safety barrier curb so that the different textures are displayed.

2.4.5 Application. The concrete treatment shall be applied to concrete surfaces at the rate of 200 sf/gallon. The penetrating sealer shall be applied by soaking the concrete surfaces at the above specified application rate.

2.4.5.1 The concrete surface temperature shall be above 35 deg F (2°C) and less than 90 deg F at time of application. In addition, all product limitations relating to the moisture content of the concrete surfaces prior to application shall be verified with the product manufacturer in written form, and approved by the Engineer.

2.4.5.2 The treatment shall be spread from puddles to dry areas.

2.4.5.3 Sealer shall be applied on no more than one sufficiently prepared lane at a time. All traffic control measures shall correspond to the location on the bridge being addressed.

2.4.5.4 If the applicator is unable to complete the entire application continuously, the location where the application was stopped shall be noted and clearly marked.

2.4.6 Measurement and Payment. No final measurement will be made unless an appreciable discrepancy exists. Payment will be made based upon the square foot of silane sealing as listed in section 2.3 of these specifications under the item "Bridge Sealing (sf)". Should it require more sealing material than listed in the table to achieve the total square footage, MoDOT will furnish the balance of the raw material needed to complete all locations. Should there be a balance of materials left over after applying the material at the accepted rate and according to these provisions, this material shall be turned over to MoDOT and delivered to the MoDOT Bridge Maintenance facility at 4360 Ohio Ave in St. Louis, MO.

2.5 Protection of Adjoining Surfaces and the Public

2.5.1 When applying a treatment, the contractor shall take reasonable precautions in protecting adjoining surfaces of the structure that are not to be sealed. The contractor shall also make provision to protect the public when treating the fascia of a bridge that spans an area used by the public.

2.5.2 Asphalt and mastic type surfaces shall be protected from spillage and heavy overspray. Plants and vegetation shall be protected from overspray by covering with drop cloths. Precautions shall be followed as indicated on the manufacturer's material and safety data sheet.

2.5.3 As the deck and appurtenances are being cleaned and/or sealed, the contractor must also provide an adequate method to block any flying debris and overspray as the work progresses. The contractor will

be responsible for claims against the Department due to flying debris, overspray, etc. caused by his negligence.

2.6 Opening to Traffic

2.6.1 Traffic shall be allowed on a deck only after a treated area does not track or upon approval by the product manufacturer.

2.7 Traffic Control

2.7.1 All traffic control is the responsibility of the contractor. Prior to beginning work the contractor shall develop detailed Traffic Control Plans (TCP). The TCP must comply with the latest edition of the *Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices* (MUTCD) or MoDOT's Engineering Policy Guide (EPG), whichever is more conservative. The TCP shall be submitted two (2) weeks prior to start of work to allow the Engineer ample time to review and approve. The TCP shall include at a minimum: the sequence of the bridges to be sealed, details of traffic control to be utilized at each location and the sealing sequence for each individual bridge location (lanes, direction, etc.)

2.8 Work Hour Restrictions

2.8.1 The Contractor shall only occupy with equipment and seal one lane at a time except for brief intervals of time required when the movement of the contractor's equipment will seriously hinder the safe movement of traffic. Periods during which the contractor will be allowed to halt traffic will be designated by the Engineer.

2.8.2 The Work shall be done during non-event weekdays or weekday evenings in order to minimize impacts to the traveling public. The approved work hours vary depending on the bridge location and traffic demands. The approved work hour schedule is designated by location in the Table of Bridges listed in Sec 2.3 of these provisions. The Contractor shall coordinate and cooperate with other regional construction projects. The Contractor shall not perform any construction activities on the bridges during restricted periods, holiday periods, or other special events as directed by the engineer. There are six major holidays per year: Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Years Day. All lanes shall be scheduled to be open to traffic during these holiday periods, starting 12:00 noon on the last working day preceding the holiday until 9:00 a.m. on the first working day subsequent to the holiday. There may be other events of regional significance, such as specific sporting events (i.e. St. Louis Cardinal home games, St. Louis Blues, St. Louis Rams, Gateway International Raceway, and other St. Louis events), that may impact traffic through the project limits. The engineer will advise the contractor of such events and how they are to be handled.

2.8.3 The contractor shall note that on a weekly basis, MoDOT's Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) Team reviews all work zones scheduled for the following week and month for the entire St. Louis District. If two or more work zones negatively impact each other's flow of traffic and traffic mitigation is not feasible or practical, MoDOT's MOT reserves the right to reject or alter those work zones.

2.8.4 Traffic Control shall be paid per Lump Sum.

2.9 Job Scheduling and Completion

2.9.1 The Engineer shall be notified at least two (2) weeks in advance of the initiation of any work or traffic restrictions to allow sufficient time for publication of media advisories to the surrounding communities. MoDOT will issue a press release to the local news media, newspaper, radio and television prior to lane closure(s). The press release will advise motorists to take alternate routing to avoid traffic congestion at the construction site and to anticipate a slowdown in traffic flow. In the event of any weather, material, or related postponement, notification shall be made to the engineer of the postponement and the re-scheduling of the roadway lane closure.

2.9.2 The completion date for this project is **September 1, 2011**.

2.10 Payment

2.10.1 Upon satisfactory completion and acceptance of all work items as specified in these provisions, the contractor shall submit an itemized invoice as instructed in these bid documents

2.10.2 Bid items for this project are as listed below

2.11 Liquidated Damage Requirements:

2.11.1 The contractor shall agree and understand that providing applying the Class 2 sealer in accordance with the requirements stated herein is considered critical to the efficient operations of MoDOT. However, since the amount of actual damages would be difficult to establish in the event the contractor fails to comply with the contractual requirements, the contractor shall agree and understand that the amount identified below as liquidated damages shall be reasonable and fair under the circumstances.

2.11.2 If the contractor does not complete the entirety of work outlined in this contract and have all Bridge(s) open to traffic by **September 1, 2011**, the Commission, the traveling public, and state and local police and governmental authorities will be damaged in various ways, including but not limited to, increased construction administration cost, potential liability, traffic and traffic flow regulation cost, traffic congestion and motorist delay, with its resulting cost to the traveling public. These damages are not reasonably capable of being computed or quantified. Therefore, the contractor will be charged with liquidated damages specified in the amount of **\$1,000** per calendar day for each calendar day that the contractor is delinquent in completing the work beyond the designated completion date.

- a. The said liquidated damages specified will be assessed regardless if whether it would otherwise be charged as liquidated damages under the Missouri Standard Specification for Highway Construction, as amended elsewhere in this contract. Days that the Department has suspended the contractor's work will not be assessed liquidated damages.

- b. The contractor shall further agree and understand that such liquidated damages shall either be deducted from the total amount due the contractor or paid by the contractor as a direct payment to MoDOT, at the sole discretion of MoDOT.
- c. The contractor shall agree and understand that the liquidated damages described herein shall not be construed as a penalty.
 - 1. The contractor shall agree and understand that all assessments of liquidated damages shall be within the discretion of MoDOT and shall be in addition to, not in lieu of, the rights of the MoDOT to pursue other appropriate remedies.

2.12 Invoicing and Payment Requirements:

- 2.12.1 The contractor shall submit an itemized invoice to the following address after the completion of deliverables, as specified herein.

- 2.12.2 Each invoice should be itemized in accordance with items listed on the purchase order and/or contract. The statewide financial management system has been designed to capture certain receipt and payment information. Therefore, each invoice submitted must reference the purchase order number and must be itemized in accordance with items listed on the purchase order. Failure to comply with this requirement may delay processing of invoices for payment.
- 2.12.3 The contractor shall be paid in accordance with the firm, fixed prices stated on the pricing page(s) of this document after completion of deliverables specified herein and acceptance by MoDOT.
- 2.12.4 Other than the payment specified above, no other payments or reimbursements shall be made to the contractor for any reason whatsoever.
- 2.12.5 MoDOT is exempt from paying Missouri Sales Tax, Missouri Use Tax and Federal Excise Tax. However, the contractor may themselves be responsible for the payment of taxes on materials they purchase to fulfill the contract. A Federal Excise Tax Exemption Certificate will be furnished to the successful bidder upon request.
- 2.12.6 Unless otherwise provided for in the solicitation documents, payment for all equipment, supplies, and/or services required herein shall be made in arrears. The Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (MHTC) shall not make any advance deposits.
- 2.12.7 The MHTC assumes no obligation for equipment, supplies, and/or services shipped or provided in excess of the quantity ordered. Any authorized quantity is subject to the MHTC's rejection and shall be returned at the contractor's expense.
- 2.12.8 Notarized weekly payroll documentation for prime and subcontractors will be required from start to finish of this contract showing compliance with prevailing wage rates. Lien Waivers from materials suppliers shall

also be provided. Additional documents shall be furnished as required by other provisions in the bid package.

2.12.9 Payment shall be made per contractor invoice upon satisfactory completion of all work items and the receipt of required documentation

2.13 Other Contractual Requirements:

2.13.1 **RSMo 285.530** - The contractor understands and agrees that by entering into a contractual agreement with MoDOT, they certify the following:

- a. The contractor shall only utilize personnel authorized to work in the United States in accordance with applicable federal and state laws. This includes, but is not limited to, the Illegal Immigration Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act (IIRIRA) and INA Section 274A.
- b. If the contractor is found to be in violation of this requirement or the applicable state, federal and local laws and regulations, and if the State of Missouri has reasonable cause to believe that the contractor has knowingly employed individuals who are not eligible to work in the United States, the state shall have the right to cancel the contract immediately without penalty or recourse and suspend or debar the contractor from doing business with the state.
- c. The contractor agrees to fully cooperate with any audit or investigation from federal, state or local law enforcement agencies.
- d. In addition, the contractor shall maintain enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services included herein.

2.13.3 Construction Safety Program:

- b. All bids/quotes/proposals must be signed with the firm name and by a responsible officer or employee. Obligations assumed by such signature must be fulfilled.
- c. By virtue of statutory authority, a preference will be given to materials, products, supplies, provisions and all other articles produced, manufactured, made or grown, within the State of Missouri.
- d. Time of delivery is a part of the consideration and, if not otherwise stated in the solicitation documents, must be stated in definite terms by the Bidder/Offeror and must be adhered to. If time varies on different items, the Bidder/Offeror shall so state.
- e. If providing bids/quotes/proposals for commodities, the Bidder/Offeror will state brand or make on each item. If bidding or proposing other than the make, model or brand specified, the manufacturer's name, model number or catalog number must be given.
- f. **For bids/proposals of \$25,000 or more**, no bids/proposals by telephone, telegram or telefax will be accepted.

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

General Performance

- a. Bidders are encouraged to obtain minority business enterprise (MBE) and women business enterprise (WBE) participation in this work through the use of subcontractors, suppliers, joint ventures, or other arrangements that afford meaningful participation for M/WBEs. Bidders are encouraged to obtain 10% MBE and 5% WBE participation.
- b. This work is to be performed under the general supervision and direction of the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) and, if awarded any portion of the work, the Contractor agrees to furnish at his own expense all labor and equipment required to complete the work, it being expressly understood that this solicitation is for completed work based upon the price(s) specified and is not a solicitation for rental of equipment or employment of labor by MoDOT, and MoDOT is to have no direction or control over the employees used by the Contractor in performance of the work.

Deliveries

- a. Unless otherwise specified on the solicitation documents or purchase order, suppliers shall give at least 24 hours advance notice of each delivery. Delivery will only be received between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Material arriving after 3:00 p.m. will not be unloaded until the following workday. No material will be received on Saturday, Sunday or state holidays.
- b. If the prices bid herein include the delivery cost of the material, the Contractor agrees to pay all transportation charges on the material as FOB - Destination. Freight costs must be included in the unit price bid and not listed as a separate line item.
- c. Any demurrage is to be paid by the Contractor direct to the railroad or carrier.

Nondiscrimination

- a. The Contractor shall comply with the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination in federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation, Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 21, as they may be amended from time to time, (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations), which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this contract.
- b. All solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the Contractor for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials or leases of the Contractor's obligations under this contract and the Regulations, will be relative to nondiscrimination on the grounds of race, color, or national origin.
 - 1) Sanctions for Noncompliance: In the event of the Contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination provisions of this contract, MoDOT shall impose such contract sanctions as it or the Federal Highway Administration may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to:
 - i. withholding of payments to the Contractor under the contract until the Contractor complies, and/or,
 - ii. cancellation, termination or suspension of the contract, in whole or in part.

Contract/Purchase Order

- a. By submitting a bid/quote/proposal, the Bidder/Offeror agrees to furnish any and all equipment, supplies and/or services specified in the solicitation documents, at the prices quoted, pursuant to all requirements and specifications contained therein.
- b. A binding contract shall consist of: (1) the solicitation documents, amendments thereto, and/or Best and Final Offer (BAFO) request(s) with any changes/additions, (2) the Contractor's proposal and/or submitted pricing, and (3) the MHTC's acceptance of the proposal and/or bid by purchase order or post-award contract.
- c. A notice of award does not constitute an authorization for shipment of equipment or supplies or a directive to proceed with services. Before providing equipment, supplies and/or services, the Contractor must receive a properly authorized purchase order and/or notice to proceed.
- d. The contract expresses the complete agreement of the parties and performance shall be governed solely by the specifications and requirements contained therein. Any change, whether by modification and/or supplementation, must be accomplished by a formal contract amendment signed and approved by and between the duly authorized representative of the Contractor and the duly authorized representative of the MHTC, by a modified purchase order prior to the effective date of such modification. The Contractor expressly and explicitly understands and agrees that no other method and/or no other document, including correspondence, acts, and oral communications by or from any person, shall be used or construed as an amendment or modification.

Subcontracting

- a. It is specifically understood that no portion of the material or any interest in the contract, shall be subcontracted, transferred, assigned or otherwise

disposed of, except with the written consent of MoDOT. Request for permission to subcontract or otherwise dispose of any part of the work shall be in writing to MoDOT and accompanied by documentation showing that the organization which will perform the work is particularly experienced and equipped for such work.

- b. Consent to subcontract or otherwise dispose of any portion of the work shall not be construed to relieve the Contractor of any responsibility for the production and delivery of the contracted work and the completion of the work within the specified time.
- c. All payments for work performed by a subcontractor shall be made to the Contractor to whom the contract was awarded and the purchase order issued.

Invoicing and Payment

- a. MoDOT is exempt from paying Missouri Sales Tax, Missouri Use Tax and Federal Excise Tax. The statewide financial management system has been designed to capture certain receipt and payment information. Therefore, each invoice submitted must reference the purchase order number and must be itemized in accordance with items listed on the purchase order. Failure to comply with this requirement may delay processing of invoices for payment.
- c. Unless otherwise provided for in the solicitation documents, payment for all equipment, supplies, and/or services required herein shall be made in arrears. The Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission (MHTC) shall not make any advance deposits.
- d. The MHTC assumes no obligation for equipment, supplies, and/or services shipped or provided in excess of the quantity ordered. Any authorized quantity is subject to the MHTC's rejection and shall be returned at the Contractor's expense.
- e. The MHTC reserves the right to purchase goods and services using the state-purchasing card.

Applicable Laws and Regulations

- a. The contract shall be construed according to the laws of the State of Missouri. The Contractor shall comply with all local, state, and federal laws and regulations related to the performance of the contract.
- b. The Contractor must be registered and maintain good standing with the Secretary of State of the State of Missouri and other regulatory agencies, as may be required by law or regulations. Such preference shall be given when quality is equal or better and delivered price is the same or less.

- 1) If attached, the document entitled "**PREFERENCE IN PURCHASING PRODUCTS**" should be completed and returned with the solicitation documents.
 - 2) If attached, the document entitled "**MISSOURI DOMESTIC PRODUCTS PROCUREMENT ACT**" should be completed and returned with the solicitation documents. **Applies if bid is Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) or more.**
- c. By virtue of statutory authority, RSMo 34.074, a preference will be given all contracts for the performance of any job or service to service-disabled veteran business either doing business as Missouri firms, corporations, or individuals; or which maintain Missouri offices or places of business, when the quality of performance promised is equal or better and the price quoted is the same or less or whenever competing bids, in their entirety, are comparable.
- 1) If attached, the document entitled "**MISSOURI SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN PREFERENCE**" should be completed and returned with the solicitation documents.
- d. In the event of a tie of low bids, the MHTC reserves the right to establish the method to be used in determining the award

Remedies and Rights

- a. No provision in the contract shall be construed, expressly or implied, as a waiver by the MHTC of any existing or future right and/or remedy available by law in the event of any claim by the MHTC of the Contractor's default or breach of contract.
- b. The Contractor agrees and understands that the contract shall constitute an assignment by the Contractor to the MHTC of all rights, title and interest in and to all causes of action that the Contractor may have under the antitrust laws of the United States or State of Missouri for which causes of action have accrued or will accrue as the result of or in relation to the particular equipment, supplies, and/or services purchased or produced by the Contractor in the fulfillment of the contract with the MHTC.
- c. In the event a Contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or supplier as a result of such direction, the Contractor may request MoDOT to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the MHTC, and, in addition, the Contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

Cancellation of Contract

- a. The MHTC may cancel the contract at any time for a material breach of contractual obligations or for convenience by providing the Contractor with written notice of cancellation. Should the MHTC exercise its right to cancel the contract for such reasons, cancellation will become effective upon the date specified in the notice of cancellation sent to the Contractor.
- b. If the MHTC cancels the contract for breach, the MHTC reserves the right to obtain the equipment, supplies, and/or services to be provided pursuant to the contract from other sources and upon such terms and in such manner as the MHTC deems appropriate and charge the Contractor for any additional costs incurred thereby.

Bankruptcy or Insolvency

- a. Upon filing for any bankruptcy or insolvency proceeding by or against the Contractor, whether voluntary or involuntary, or upon the appointment of a receiver, trustee, or assigned the benefit or creditors, the Contractor must notify MoDOT immediately. Upon learning of any such actions, the MHTC reserves the right, at its sole discretion, to either cancel the contract or affirm the contract and hold the Contractor responsible for damages.

Inventions, Patents, and Copyrights

- a. The Contractor shall defend, protect, and hold harmless the MHTC, its officers, agents, and employees against all suits of law or in equity resulting from patent and copyright infringement concerning the Contractor's performance or products produced under the terms of the contract.

Inspection and Acceptance

- a. No equipment, supplies, and/or services received by MoDOT pursuant to a contract shall be deemed accepted until MoDOT has had reasonable opportunity to inspect said equipment, supplies, and/or services.
- b. All equipment, supplies, and/or services which do not comply with the specifications and/or requirements or which are otherwise unacceptable or defective may be rejected. In addition, all equipment, supplies, and/or services which are discovered to be defective or which do not conform to any warranty of the Contractor upon inspection (or at any later time if the defects contained were not reasonably ascertainable upon the initial inspection) may be rejected.
- c. The MHTC reserves the right to return any such rejected shipment at the Contractor's expense for full credit or replacement and to specify a reasonable date by which replacements must be received.
- d. The MHTC's right to reject any unacceptable equipment, supplies, and/or services shall not exclude any other legal, equitable or contractual remedies the MHTC may have.

Warranty

- a. The Contractor expressly warrants that all equipment, supplies, and/or services provided shall: (1) conform to each and every specification, drawing, sample or other description which was furnished to or adopted by MoDOT, (2) be fit and sufficient for the purpose expressed in the solicitation documents, (3) be merchantable, (4) be of good materials and workmanship, and (5) be free from defect.
- b. Such warranty shall survive delivery and shall not be deemed waived either by reason of the MHTC's acceptance of or payment for said equipment, supplies, and/or services.

Status of Independent Contractor

- a. The Contractor represents itself to be an independent Contractor offering such services to the general public and shall not represent itself or its employees to be an employee of the MHTC. Therefore, the Contractor shall assume all legal and financial responsibility for taxes, FICA, employee fringe benefits, workers' compensation, employee insurance, minimum wage requirements, overtime, etc., and agrees to indemnify, save and hold the MHTC, its officers, agents and employees harmless from and against any and all losses (including attorney fees) and damage of any kind related to such matters.

Indemnification

- a. The Offeror shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Commission, including its members and department employees, from any claim or liability whether based on a claim for damages to real or personal property or to a person for any matter relating to or arising out of the Offeror's performance of its obligations under this Agreement.

SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The Contractor shall maintain or cause to be maintained at Contractor's own expense commercial general liability, automobile liability, worker's compensation insurance against negligent acts, errors or omissions of the Contractor, or its subcontractors and anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them. Any insurance policy required as specified in this Section shall be written by a company that is licensed and authorized to issue such insurance in the state of Missouri and shall provide insurance coverage for not less than the following limits of liability:

- a. General Liability: Not less than \$500,000 for any one person in a single accident or occurrence, and not less than \$3,000,000 for all claims arising out of a single occurrence;
- b. Automobile Liability: Not less than \$500,000 for any one person in a single accident or occurrence, and not less than \$3,000,000 for all claims arising out of a single occurrence;
- c. Missouri State Workmen's Compensation policy or equivalent in accordance with state law.

Upon request from the Commission, the Contractor shall provide the Commission with certificates of insurance evidencing the required coverage and that such insurance is in effect.

Required Specifications

- a. The material to be supplied under the contract will comply with the quality and gradation requirements of the **Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, Edition of 2004**, and any revisions thereto, unless modified by these specifications.

Information and Reports

- a. The Contractor shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations, or Directives issued pursuant thereto, and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the Missouri Department of Transportation or the Federal Highway Administration to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Regulations or Directives. Where any information required of a Contractor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information the Contractor shall so certify to the Missouri Department of Transportation, or the Federal Highway Administration as appropriate, and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.

Permits, Licenses and Safety Issues

- a. The contract price shall include any necessary permits and licenses required by law incidental to the work. Local ordinances requiring building permits are not applicable to state agencies.
- b. The Contractor will comply with local laws involving safety in the prosecution of the work.

Failure to Execute Contract

- a. Failure to execute the contract and file acceptable performance payment (Contract Bond) or cashier's check, bank money order or certified check within **15 days** after the contract has been mailed to the bidder shall be just cause for the cancellation of the award and the forfeiture of the proposal guaranty. Award may then be made to the next lowest responsible bidder, or the work may be re-advertised and performed under contract or otherwise, as the Commission may decide. No contract shall be considered effective until it has been executed by all parties thereto.

Notice to Proceed

- a. Within **30 days** after the execution of the contract, a **"Notice to Proceed"** will be issued by the Department. A purchase order will be attached to the "Notice to Proceed," which will specify the date or dates that the Contractor can start delivery, roadway or stockpile delivery and will also include the completion dates. These dates will be in accordance with the dates shown in the proposal.

Delivery – Additional Requirements

- a. The following days shall be construed as **official holidays** under the terms of the contract:

January 1	New Year's Day
Third Monday in January	Martin Luther King, Jr.'s Birthday
February 12	Lincoln's Birthday
Third Monday in February	Washington's Birthday
May 8	Truman's Birthday
Last Monday in May	Memorial Day

November 11	Veteran's Day
Fourth Thursday in November	Thanksgiving Day
December 25	Christmas Day

- b. When any of the above **holidays falls** on a **Sunday**, the holiday will be observed on the following **Monday**; when any of the above **holidays falls** on a **Saturday**, the **holiday** will be observed on the immediately preceding **Friday**.

Temporary Suspension of Work

- a. The **District Engineer** shall have authority to suspend work wholly or in part for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary when weather or other conditions are such that in the opinion of the engineer, the work may be done at a later time with advantage to the Department or for failure on the part of the Contractor to comply with any of the provisions of the Contract.
- b. If the Department suspends the work for its own advantages and not because of the Contractor's failure to comply with the Contract, the Contractor will be allowed an equal number of calendar days after the completion date for the completion of the work. The Department may at its discretion give the Contractor an extension of time for completing the work where the Contractor incurs delays for causes beyond his control.
- c. Normal rainfall is not considered a cause qualifying for an extension of time. Claim for extension of time for all causes must be submitted by the Contractor in writing within **30 Days** after the claimed cause for the delay has ceased to exist.

Cancellation of Contract

- a. If the Contractor/supplier fails to carry out the performance of the work with sufficient workmen and equipment to insure the completion of the delivery within the time specified or becomes insolvent or is adjudicated a bankrupt or commits any act of bankruptcy or insolvency or allows any final judgment to stand against him for a period of ten (10) days, the Missouri Department of Transportation may give notice in writing by registered mail to the Contractor/supplier and the surety of such delay, neglect or default.
- b. If, within ten (10) days after such notice the Contractor/supplier does not proceed to remedy to the satisfaction of the Department's representatives the faults specified in said notice, or the surety does not proceed to take over the deliveries, the Department shall have full power and authority, without impairing the obligation of the Contractor/supplier under the contract or the surety under the bond, to take over the completion of the work and arrange for the shipment of any materials necessary to complete the work and the Contractor/supplier and the surety will be responsible for any additional costs incurred by the Department in obtaining the completion of the deliveries.

Environmental Issues

Attention of the bidder is invited to the **Land Reclamation Act, Chapter 444, Laws of 1971, (House Bill 519)** and the necessity for compliance if applicable.

The Contractor shall take necessary precautions and shall schedule and conduct his operations so as to avoid or minimize siltation of streams while removing gravel there from.

Prohibition Of Employment Of Unauthorized Aliens:

- a. Pursuant to RSMo 285.530 (1), no business entity or employer shall knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the state of Missouri. As a condition for the award of any contract or grant in excess of five thousand dollars by the state or by any political subdivision of the state to a business entity, or for any business entity receiving a state-administered or subsidized tax credit, tax abatement, or loan from the state, the business entity shall, by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, affirm its enrollment and participation in a federal work authorization program with respect to the employees working in connection with the contracted services. Every such business entity shall

sign an affidavit affirming that it does not knowingly employ any person who is unauthorized alien in connection with the contracted services. [RSMO 285.530 (2)] A copy of the affidavit referenced above is provided within this document.

E-Verify is an example of a federal work authorization program. Acceptable enrollment and participation documentation consists of **completed** copy of the E-Verify Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).
