U.S. 65 through the City of Lincoln was a two lane roadway with no shoulders before construction began in fall 2009.




As the project came to a close in late August, crews focused on striping and finishing the roadway shoulders. The new roadway has two lanes in each direction and a center-turn lane.

U.S. Route 65 Widening Through Lincoln

Award Date

September 2, 2009

Project Description

The project included grading and drainage work to widen the highway to five lanes through Lincoln. The new highway includes two southbound and two northbound lanes, along with a center-turn lane.

The work is part of a larger construction project to improve Route 65 through Benton County, from just south of Route 52 to just north of the Osage River in Warsaw. A \$19.3 million project to widen 13 miles of Route 65 to four lanes began in July 2010.
