

# Route 5 Shared Four-Lane Highway Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony Camden County, Missouri

**The Missouri Department of Transportation** invites you to celebrate the completion of a \$20.4 million project to relocate eight miles of Route 5 and construct a shared four-lane highway from Camdenton to just south of the Laclede County line.


**A ribbon-cutting ceremony** will take place on Tuesday, Oct. 26, 2010 at 11 a.m. on the new highway, just south of the interchange where new Route 5 meets old Route 5. See the enclosed map for details.

**A shared four-lane highway** consists of alternating passing lanes along a conventional two-lane highway to provide motorists with periodic opportunities to pass vehicles without having to drive in the opposing lane.

**The entire shared four-lane project**, including another 10 miles of Route 5 in Laclede County, is an innovative highway design that will increase safety and traffic flow along the Route 5 corridor. Another \$7.2 million phase to complete the Laclede County portion of the project is expected to be complete in early 2011.

Directions:  
From Business Route 5, take the southbound entrance ramp to the new highway and ceremony location.

The ceremony will take place on the new shared four-lane highway in Camden, just south of the new Route 5/old Route 5 interchange.

Parade of Vehicles:  
A parade of vehicles will begin after the ceremony.

The parade will travel south on the new shared four-lane highway, u-turn at the Camden County line, and then travel back the entire length of the project.

Vehicles can exit Route 5 at U.S. 54 in Camden.
