Project Description:

Grading, drainage, bridges, paving and utilities for four miles of new four-lane expressway. This is the second half of construction on the expressway — the first five-mile section, between the Osage River in Miller County and Grand Glaize Bridge, opened to traffic in September 2010.

Location:

From the Grand Glaize Bridge to just west of Route KK in Camden County.
