

**IDC RFB ADDENDUM #1:**

QUESTION: Do I need to submit the annual worker eligibility and applicant affidavit forms with the bid?

Depending on the form of business that you have, you should complete *either* the **Applicant Affidavit for Sole-Proprietorship or Partnership** or the **Annual Worker Eligibility Verification Affidavit** and return it with your bid. The form is required before an award can be made.

QUESTION: If there is a District that we are not interested in bidding do we leave the sheet blank or do we have to bid all the Districts?

You are under no obligation to bid an entire district. You may bid only one county in a district or one region within a district. Those counties that you do not wish to bid may be left blank or place a horizontal line in the block to indicate "No Bid".

QUESTION: What category would emergency services pricing fall under (maintenance or prevailing wage)? Or is there separate pricing?

Emergency pricing could be at either the maintenance rate or prevailing wage depending on the size and nature of the emergency. There is not separate pricing for emergency services.
