

Historic Bridge Available for Adaptive Reuse:



Saline Creek Bridge (H0119), Miller County, Missouri

Historic Bridge H0119 carrying Route 17 over Saline Creek in central Missouri will be available for adaptive reuse at a new location later this year. It is being offered to potential recipients who must agree to move the structure, preserve the bridge and features which make it historic, and assume all legal and financial responsibilities. If the bridge (or parts thereof) is transferred to another party, deed covenants may require the new owner to re-erect and maintain the bridge in accordance with established standards for historic bridges. **Description:** Built in 1925, it consists of a steel, six-panel, rigid-connected, Pratt through truss with two Warren pony truss approach spans. The main span is 120 feet long, and the total bridge length is 288 feet. It is supported on steel-reinforced concrete abutments, wingwalls, and dumbbell piers. The roadway width is 20 feet curb-to-curb. H0119 is one of the older surviving members of this truss type in the state. It is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under NRHP Criterion C in the area of Engineering.

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
