You're Invited!

The last public meeting for the Route 150 Widening Project will be held on **February 27, 2007 at Meadowmere Elementary School** (7010 E. 136th Street) in Grandview, Missouri **from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.** This is your opportunity to review the preliminary design plans for Route 150 spanning from Route 71 on the west to Route 291 on the east. Similar to other public meetings for the project, this one will be formatted as an informal open house, so you are encouraged to come and go as you want while reviewing the exhibits and sharing comments with MoDOT and the design team.



What You'll See

Preliminary Plans

Preliminary plans showing the proposed right-of-way, including acreages from individual properties, needed to complete the improvement to the roadway will be presented for your review and comment. This is the first time that such detailed plans will have been presented to Route 150 residents and stakeholders. In addition, the following will also be on display:



- Roadway alignment and grades.
- Access management plans including the locations of traffic signals, turn lanes, and jug handles (U-turn accommodation).
- Sound wall locations, heights, and potential wall materials.
- Landscape Concept that illustrates priority roadway enhancements, such as landscaping and trail connections.
- Relation of the Route 150 Widening to the redesign of the Route 71/150 Interchange estimated to begin summer 2007.
- Reference material including the Transcript from the 2001 Route 150 Public Hearing and the 2006 Value Engineering Report.

Priority Road Enhancements

What Residents & Stakeholders Said

A fifth Community Coffee (small, public open house) was held mid-December 2006 at Meadowmere Elementary School for Route 150 residents and stakeholders. Because the meeting focused on roadway enhancements, participants were encouraged to vote for the type of enhancement—walkability, trail connections, median treatment, and signage—they would most like to see implemented as part of the Route 150 Widening. Overall, participants indicated the following in order of priority:

- **1st Priority:** Improving the median with “other landscaping” beyond concrete, trees, and grass.
- **2nd Priority:** Improving walkability, especially in the Kansas City portion of the corridor.
- **3rd Priority:** Developing monument signs for the cities within the corridor.
- **4th Priority:** Providing connections to existing trails.

With this feedback in mind, a Landscape Concept will be created for the roadway that supports defined priorities. Later Grandview, Kansas City, and Lee’s Summit will have the opportunity to apply for enhancement funds through the Mid-America Regional Council in support of the Concept.

Roadway Design is Happening

Project Overview

The Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) plans to widen an 8-mile section of Missouri Route 150 from Missouri Route 71 to Missouri Route 291 from the existing two lanes to four lanes. The project is being funded with Amendment 3 dollars totaling approximately \$30 million. Missouri voters approved Amendment 3—Smoother, Safer, Sooner—in 2004 to enhance the condition and accelerate the completion of the state’s priority road and bridge projects. The project will involve the development of a plan for access management, preliminary design, right-of-way design, bridge design, and final design.
